


THE WORLD'S LARGEST DIAPER DRIVE 2024



HOLY SPIRIT, COME


Reflection on John 20:19-23

A great teacher and mentor, Sr. Margaret Ormond, OP, once described life in the Spirit as "being firmly planted in mid-air." Having reflected on this image for over 40 years, I am still learning to appreciate the depth of its invitation.

Jesus is God incarnate, and the incarnation beckons us to see and recognize God in the ordinary, in fleshiness and physicality, in time and space. This is the Church – the Body of Christ – in its pilgrimage on earth. This is our sacramental life, our rootedness, firmly, in the life, teachings and authority of the Church.

The Holy Spirit of God, represented scripturally in tongues of flame, in a great rushing wind, blows where it will. In silence and contemplation, we attune ourselves to the movements and gifts of the Spirit, and so become poised, ready, and malleable to go where the Spirit leads. This is the "mid-air" stance of our spiritual lives.

SAINT BERNARDINE OF SIENA

Saint of the Day: May 20

Patron Saint of: Advertising and Gambling

Most of the saints suffered great personal opposition, even persecution. Bernardine, by contrast, seems more like a human dynamo who simply took on the needs of the world. He was the greatest preacher of his time, journeying across Italy, calming strife-torn cities, attacking the paganism he found rampant, attracting crowds of 30,000, following Saint Francis of Assisi's admonition to preach about "vice and virtue, punishment and glory."

Compared with Saint Paul by the pope, Bernardine had a keen intuition of the needs of the time, along with solid holiness and boundless energy and joy.

When he was 20, the plague was at its height in his hometown of Siena. Sometimes as many as 20 people died in one day at the hospital. Bernardine offered to run the hospital and, with the help of other young men, nursed patients there for four months. He escaped the plague, but was so exhausted that a fever confined him for several months.

At 22, he entered the Franciscan Order and was ordained two years later. For almost a dozen years he lived in solitude and prayer, but his gifts ultimately caused him to be sent to preach. He always traveled on foot, sometimes speaking for hours in one place, then doing the same in another town.

Especially known for his devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus, Bernardine devised a symbol – IHS, the first three letters of the name of Jesus in Greek – in Gothic letters on a blazing sun. This was to displace the superstitious symbols of the day.

General of the Friars of the Strict Observance, a branch of the Franciscan Order, Bernardine strongly emphasized scholarship and further study of theology and canon law. He returned to preaching the last two years of his life, dying while traveling.
