Pastor's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend, we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The encounter we experience with Jesus in today's Gospel is one of love. Jesus enters the house of Simon Peter and brings healing to his sick mother-in-law. Later that day, He offers healing to many who are brought to Him with their own ailments and finally, on the next day, He offers healing to those possessed by demons.

It is interesting to note that Mark, when referring to the Greek word Jesus uses to "help Peter's mother-in-law up," uses the verb *egeiro*, which is frequently used in reference to Jesus' own Resurrection. In this context, Jesus actually raises Peter's mother-in-law. This miracle could be viewed as a foreshadowing of the eschatological resurrection wrought in mankind through Christ's own death and resurrection.

Following this encounter with Peter's mother-in-law, Jesus cures the sick and then withdraws from Capernaum. The first of these two stories shows that His miracles were not restricted to a few, and that they were a manifestation of His messiahship, even if only demons were able to penetrate this secret.

Jesus' departure was occasioned by the false messianic hopes engendered by His miracles. The other occasions on which Jesus prays are times of stress connected with the true nature of His messiahship. Simon and those with Him pursued Him. This expression usually designates Jesus' disciples, but note how Mark avoids calling them "disciples" as if to suggest that their present way of acting puts them rather in opposition to Jesus.

"Everyone is looking for you:" in Mark, this always occurs in contexts suggesting an evil intention or at least a misguided sort of seeking. Simon implies that Jesus should remain at Capernaum and capitalize on the popularity aroused by His miracles. But Jesus refuses to confine His ministry to one place or encourage the messianic hopes of the crowds.

"For this purpose, I have come:" Jesus opens the promise of hope for salvation to all, His desire as such, is to preach the Word of God, of whom He is, and allow all an opportunity for mercy and love. This should give us all hope. The messiah is not only for a select group of people, rather, for the whole of humanity. God's promise is not limited to a few, rather, for all.

Perhaps this week we can intentionally offer thanks to God for the promise He has offered us and open our hearts to respond to this promise more intentionally in our own lives.

VESSELS OF GRACE

Reflection on Mark 1:29-39

An illness or disease, whether physical, emotional, or spiritual, especially if chronic or persistent, can make daily life seem a drudgery and empty a person of any joy or happiness. The complaints of Job in the first reading echo the miserable feelings many sick people endure. Is it any wonder that so much of Jesus' ministry involves healing, curing diseases, and driving out demons? There is always more in these healing stories than just the restoration of health; an accompanying inner healing or transformation leads to new attitudes open once again to joy and meaning in life.

Notice also that the response of Simon's mother-in-law, after being healed by Jesus, is to serve. This is always the appropriate response to grace – to give it away again in acts of love and service. Grace is meant to be shared, and in sharing what we have received, we become vessels of grace, bearing Christ to those we meet in our journey who are in need of healing and strength.

SAINT SCHOLASTICA

Saint of the Day: February 10

Patron Saint of: Cloistered Nuns

Born in 480 of wealthy parents, twins, Scholastica and Benedict were brought up together until he left central Italy for Rome to continue his studies. Little is known of Scholastica's early life. She founded a religious community for women near Monte Cassino at Plombariola, five miles from where her brother governed a monastery.

The twins visited each other once a year in a farmhouse because Scholastica was not permitted inside the monastery. They spent these times discussing spiritual matters.

According to the Dialogues of St. Gregory the Great, the brother and sister spent their last day together in prayer and conversation. Scholastica sensed her death was close at hand and she begged Benedict to stay with her until the next day. He refused her request because he did not want to spend a night outside the monastery, thus breaking his own Rule. Scholastica asked God to let her brother remain and a severe thunderstorm broke out, preventing Benedict and his monks from returning to the abbey. Benedict cried out, "God forgive you, Sister. What have you done?" Scholastica replied, "I asked a favor of you and you refused. I asked it of God and he granted it."

Brother and sister parted the next morning after their long discussion. Three days later, Benedict was praying in his monastery and saw the soul of his sister rising heavenward in the form of a white dove. Benedict then announced the death of his sister to the monks and later buried her in the tomb he had prepared for himself.

Scholastica and Benedict gave themselves totally to God and gave top priority to deepening their friendship with him through prayer. In coming closer to Christ they found they were also closer to each other.
