Pastor's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend, we celebrate the First Sunday of the Season of Lent. This season offers each of us an opportunity to reflect on our relationship with the Lord and to consider how our actions have either negatively or positively affected that relationship, while acknowledging our need for God's mercy in our daily lives.

In the Gospel this weekend, we see Jesus experience a very human interaction – He is driven out into the desert and is tempted by Satan. This can seem pretty shocking to us at first glance, because we can understand a bit of Jesus' vulnerability, which doesn't seem to fit with our understanding of the Messiah.

Jesus permits Himself to be tempted in the desert, because He wishes to experience humanity as we do ... the only difference, of course, is that Jesus doesn't allow this temptation to lead Him into sin.

Our human struggle with what the Church calls "concupiscence," or an "inclination to sin," is an effect of original sin. Our eyes are somewhat blinded by the allure of sin and the temptation of the devil can weigh more on our hearts. This is why we call Satan the "Father of Lies." It is through this "lie" of sin that we turn our gaze away from God and on ourselves and other worldly occupations.

Our need for God is clear. This example of Jesus in today's Gospel should give us hope, because through Him and our reliance on Him, we can overcome temptation as He has. Jesus became man to teach us what it truly means to be man; that is, to live as man in true freedom for God.

During this Lenten Season, may we open our hearts to the example of Jesus and turn to our loving God in times of temptation and need, gazing upon His merciful heart, which so desires to lead us to our heavenly home. May we run to Him in our weakness and seek His merciful love in the Sacrament of Reconciliation – so that we may be reconciled to the world, and to God Himself.

HOMESCHOOL GATHERING



REPENTANCE

Reflection on Mark 1:12-15

We heard on Ash Wednesday that Lent is all about repentance. We discover today, in the first reading, that God isn't asking us to do anything God Himself has not considered first. The drama of the story of Noah and the flood – with the ark, the animals, the deluge – can overshadow a more central aspect of the story. It is a story about God's first covenant with His people, and strangely, we find God providing humanity with an example of new resolve, a kind of repentance.

Our covenant with God is fundamental to what we are about in Lent. While God has taken the initiative in forging the covenant with us, it is a mutual pact, with obligations on both sides. Each of us has entered into this covenant in Baptism, pledging our lives in fidelity to God, while God has pledged to use His saving grace always.

We repent in order to return to Baptism, to return to the covenant. We embrace a new resolve to return with boldness to our baptismal obligations. Yes, this repentance must involve admitting that we have failed, have sinned, have not lived up to our side of the covenant. Directly into this sorrow, Jesus will enter with forgiveness and the steadfast, undying love that leads us home to the promised land of Easter. ~ Fr. Jay
